

Travelling to Olympia

As we're sure you're aware Transport for London's (TfL) has chosen to reduce the weekday underground service to Olympia. This link will still run on weekends and bank holidays.

We've put together a new map (shown below) detailing how to get to Olympia, which highlights the recently upgraded London Overground Service.

Kensington (Olympia) is one stop from Shepherd's Bush (Central line) and West Brompton (District line).

Furthermore we have successfully worked with TfL to put positive measures in place to alleviate any negative effects. In addition to new station signage and on-train announcements, TfL will be investing in Legible London mapping solutions in print, online and at street level, in numerous positions around the local area. We expect all of this to be completed by early 2012.

The new map also promotes alternative routes. For example, Baron's Court Tube station (Piccadilly and District Line) is eight minutes walk away, whilst Hammersmith Tube station (Piccadilly, District, Hammersmith & City, Circle Lines) is 10 minutes walk away. There are also three buses connecting Hammersmith to Olympia and High Street Kensington; numbers 9, 10, and 27.
