

TRAVELLING TO OLYMPIA

From December 2011, Transport for London (TfL) are reducing the weekday tube service of the District Line to Kensington (Olympia) Station.

Olympia remains very well connected by public transport:

- The London Overground, together with Southern, service has been recently upgraded to provide up to five trains an hour.
- This connects Olympia with Clapham Junction, West Brompton (District Line), Shepherd's Bush (Central Line) and Willesden Junction.
- The journey is a similar process, but better service, than the District Line.
- Instead of going to Earls Court and changing on to a one stop service to Olympia, you go to Shepherds Bush or West Brompton and change on to a one stop service to Olympia.
- The Overground service is quicker, more reliable and more frequent. For full details of this service click [here](#)
- The Overground service is also integrated into the [TfL journey planner](#)
- Baron's Court Tube station (Piccadilly and District Line) is eight minutes walk away.
- Hammersmith Tube station (Piccadilly, District, Hammersmith & City, Circle Lines) is 10 minutes walk away.
- There are also four buses connecting Hammersmith to Olympia. Numbers 9, 10, 27. They also run in the opposite way from High Street Kensington (Circle & District).
